Enjoy roving performances, puppetry, and live music, and join in at one of Moon Lantern Trail's interactive workshops.

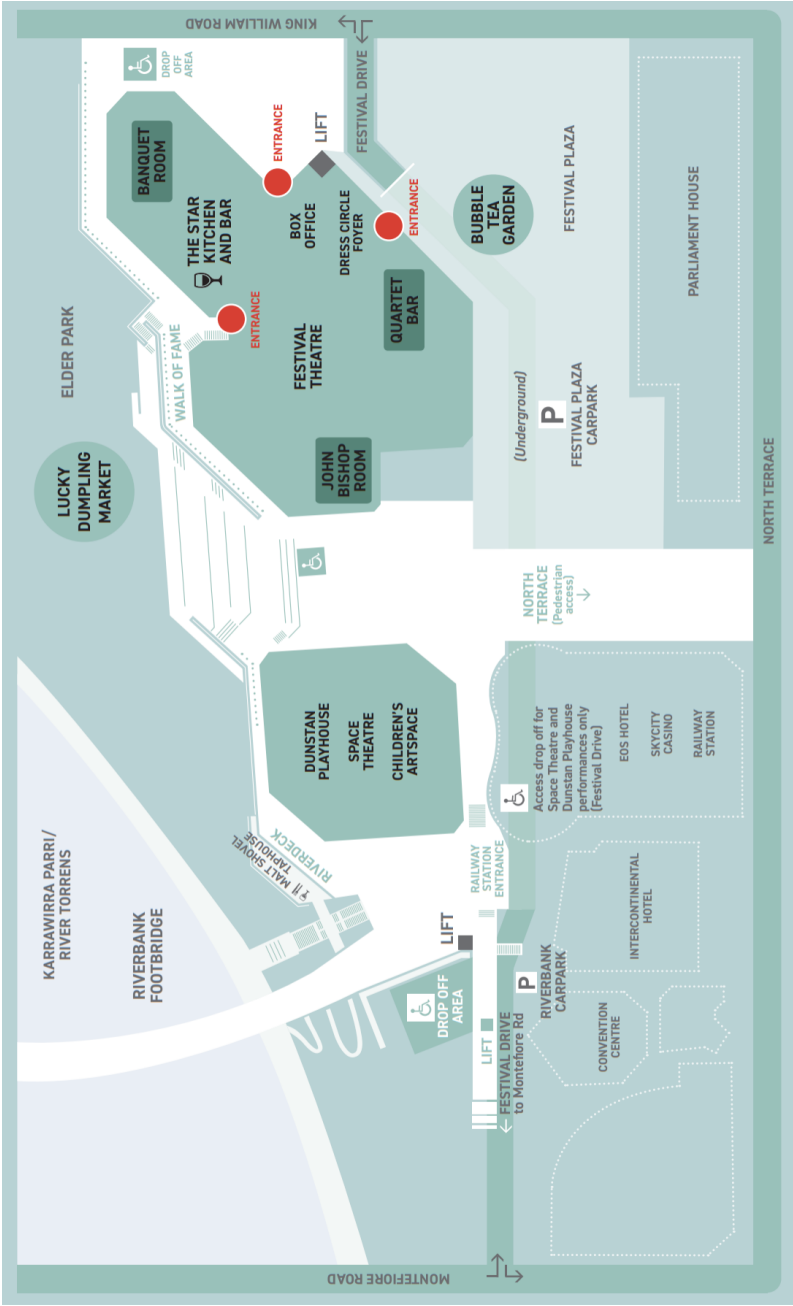

OVERVIEW OF ADELAIDE

For those who aren't familiar with this fine city of ours, Adelaide City is framed by 4 terraces (streets): North Terrace, South Terrace, East Terrace and West Terrace, and surrounded by parklands.

Adelaide Fast Facts

Population	1.31 million
Money Exchange	The currency is Australian Dollars (AUD\$) and can be purchased at a money exchange, such as next to Haigh's Chocolates on the corner of King William St & Rundle Mall. All Australia Post outlets and major banks can provide currency exchange. Most shops take credit cards from around the world.
Drinks Terminology	Schooner (285mls - small) Pint (425mls - large)
Shopping Hours	As a general rule, shops in the city are open on Monday to Thursday from 9am–6pm; Friday is late night shopping and most shops are open from 9am–9pm; on weekends shops tend to open a bit later and close at 5pm.
Smoking	Please note that smoking is prohibited in all public building food service areas, including cafés, restaurants and pubs and underneath sheltered public transport stops.
Alcohol	It is illegal for people under the age of 18 to buy and consume alcohol. Consumption of alcohol on the streets and in some public areas is also prohibited.
Weather	It is currently the Australian Spring. Average temperatures are between 11.8–22°C (53.2–71.6°F). Rainfall is low but evenings can be quite cool as temperatures drop quickly, so wear layers!

The Adelaide Visitor Information Centre is located in the heart of the city – 25 Pirie Street, Adelaide. It offers assistance to local, interstate and overseas visitors.

Lost Passport

If you lose your passport in Australia, you should immediately call the Passport Office on 13 12 32. It is an offence not to report a lost or stolen passport. When calling, provide as much information as possible. Replacements may take time to be processed, however you are able to ask for temporary travelling papers that will permit you to re-enter your home country.

GETTING AROUND ADELAIDE

Getting around Adelaide on foot is relatively easy, but we have lots of free transport options too!

FREE TRAMS

Trams within the city area are free and will take you from your hotel to the Adelaide Festival Centre, the Adelaide Central Markets, the Botanic Gardens and everywhere in between.

There are also free city loop buses through various spots in Adelaide and North Adelaide. Look out for the 98A/98C and 99A/99C buses.

TRAMS, TRAINS and BUSES

To go further afield, Adelaide's public transport system includes buses, trains and trams that travel throughout the Adelaide Metropolitan and regional areas.

Tickets can be purchased on-board buses (card payment only) and vending machines on-board trams, trains and at the Railway Station. Purchasing a Metrocard is the easiest option. Tickets can also be purchased from the Adelaide Metro Info Centre located at Adelaide Railway Station.

SHOPPING / EATING IN ADELAIDE

There are lots of great shops and eating options in and around the city. Be sure to check out the *Adelaide Visitor Guide* in your Artist Bag for recommendations. Otherwise, here are a few suggestions:

Rundle Mall ('The Mall')

The main hub of shopping in the city. This is the place to visit all the mainstream department stores. You should pay a special visit to Haigh's Chocolates (corner of King William Rd) for locally-made delicious chocolate.

Rundle Street

The continuation of Rundle Mall has designer shopping as well as plenty of alfresco dining.

Leigh Street / Peel Street / Bank Street

There are a lot of great cafés, bars, quirky stores, excellent coffee and personal Adelaide services. Check out Bread & Bone for great burgers, our speakeasy bar Maybe Mae, Clever Little Tailor if you like a great whiskey and Udaberri if you enjoy a bottle of wine.

Gouger Street / Chinatown

Adelaide's Chinatown is located on Moonta Street, which runs between Grote Street and Gouger Street, just next to the Central Markets. Here you will find many Asian supermarkets, food halls and restaurants. Gouger Street features many great restaurants and cafés with a strong representation of Asian cuisine.

Good spots outside of the city:

Glenelg beach – the tram will take you straight there in 35 mins.

Lucia's Fine Foods, Markets: vintage Italian café whose coffee will keep you buzzing until well after lunchtime. Their adjoining smallgoods shop is home to fresh pasta, pasta sauces, antipasto ingredients and olive oil.

Providore, arguably the best chocolate-crackles anywhere, plus beautiful cakes and sweets.

Saudade, some of the best Portuguese tarts you will find, get yourself a box and one to have straight away, while it's warm!

Charlesworth Nuts, gift packs, roasted, spicy or sugared.

The Kangaroo Island Stall, stocking producers from Kangaroo Island, sample locally made gin or purchase gifts for your family. We highly recommend the raw honeycomb!

Dumpling King, 85 Grote St: All things dumplings and as much free tea as you like!

Hong Phat BBQ Restaurant, 75 Grote St: The best suckling pork and salt-and-pepper tofu around. The duck and chicken are very nice as well. One of the nicest, cheapest eats you'll find.

Ying Chow, 114 Gouger St: an Adelaide institution and famous for their 'BBC' (broadbeans, beancurd and Chinese chutney), this late night spot is reliably delicious. Top of your must order list is the aforementioned BBC and tea smoked duck.

PLACES OF INTEREST

Art Gallery of South Australia: (North Terrace)

Open every day 10am-5pm

Home to over 45,000 works of art from Australia, North America, Asia, and Europe, and a collection of Indigenous art. Browse a number of touring and ongoing exhibitions, including Misty Mountain, Shining Moon: Japanese landscape envisioned. Take a tour, or go at your own pace - make a day of it!

Adelaide Zoo: (Frome Road)

Open every day 9:30am-5pm

Exhibited over 8 hectares, and home to 250 species of native and exotic mammals, reptiles, birds and fish. Go on a free guided walking tour, or make a schedule to see as many free keeper talks as possible. Better yet, book an Animal Experience, and come face-to-face with a giraffe or a meerkat!

South Australian Museum: (North Terrace)

Open every day 10am-5pm

Explore through the 5 floors and over 4 million specimens and objects from Australian Aboriginal Cultures, to Ancient Egypt. The Australian Geographic Nature Photographer of the Year 2023 exhibition runs from 26 Aug - 29 Oct.

MOD: (North Terrace)

Tues-Sat 10am-5pm

Sun-Mon CLOSED

A museum of futuristic discovery. Where science meets art and innovation. Ever changing programs to inspire and delight.

Jam Factory: (Morphett Street)

Open daily 10am-5pm

A not-for-profit space which promotes and supports Adelaide crafters and designers. View the latest exhibition of ceramics or glass blown pieces in the galleries, or take a free guided tour Mon-Wed 11am.

River Torrens Linear Trail:

Feeling like some fresh air with a view? Go for a walk along the River Torrens (or Karrawirra Parri, meaning "river of the Red Gum forest"). The river flows along 30km from the Adelaide Hills, through the CBD, down to the mouth at West Beach/Henley Beach.

Adelaide Street Art:

Since 2016, the Fringe Street Art Explosion program has commissioned the creation of more than 30 public murals across Adelaide. Some are easy to spot, while others are down alley ways or higher places. Go for a wander and see how many you can find!

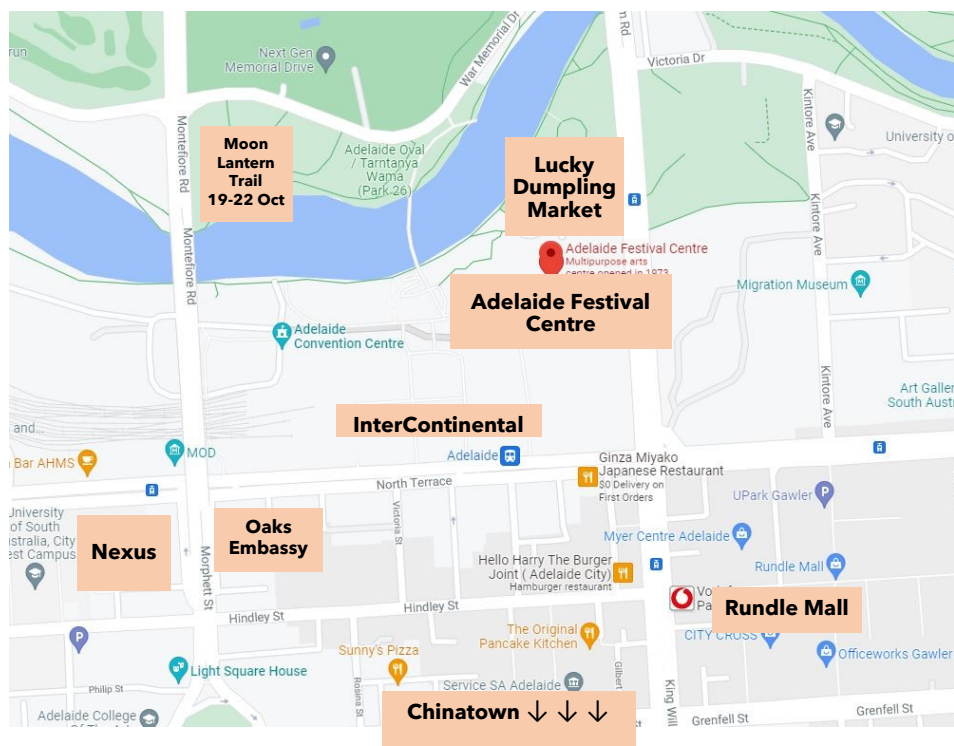
