Assessment Two

Your Leadership Journey Day Two - Preparation

For our morning session you will need to think of a recent and powerful leadership experience (good or bad). Briefly describe it (no more than a paragraph or two) and then reflect on what you learnt from this experience. How did the experience change you as a leader (write as much as you feel you need to write)? Be prepared to share this on the day.

Minimum 200 words, shared orally and discussed in session.

Tuesday 24 October 2023

For the afternoon session please give some thought to your biggest leadership challenge - something that you find tough to do such as having tough conversations, meeting high risk work challenges, being open and authentic, delegating and so on. This challenge must be about you, specifically. We are going to go deeper into understanding what holds you back in the face of these challenges in order to realise more of your potential.


