

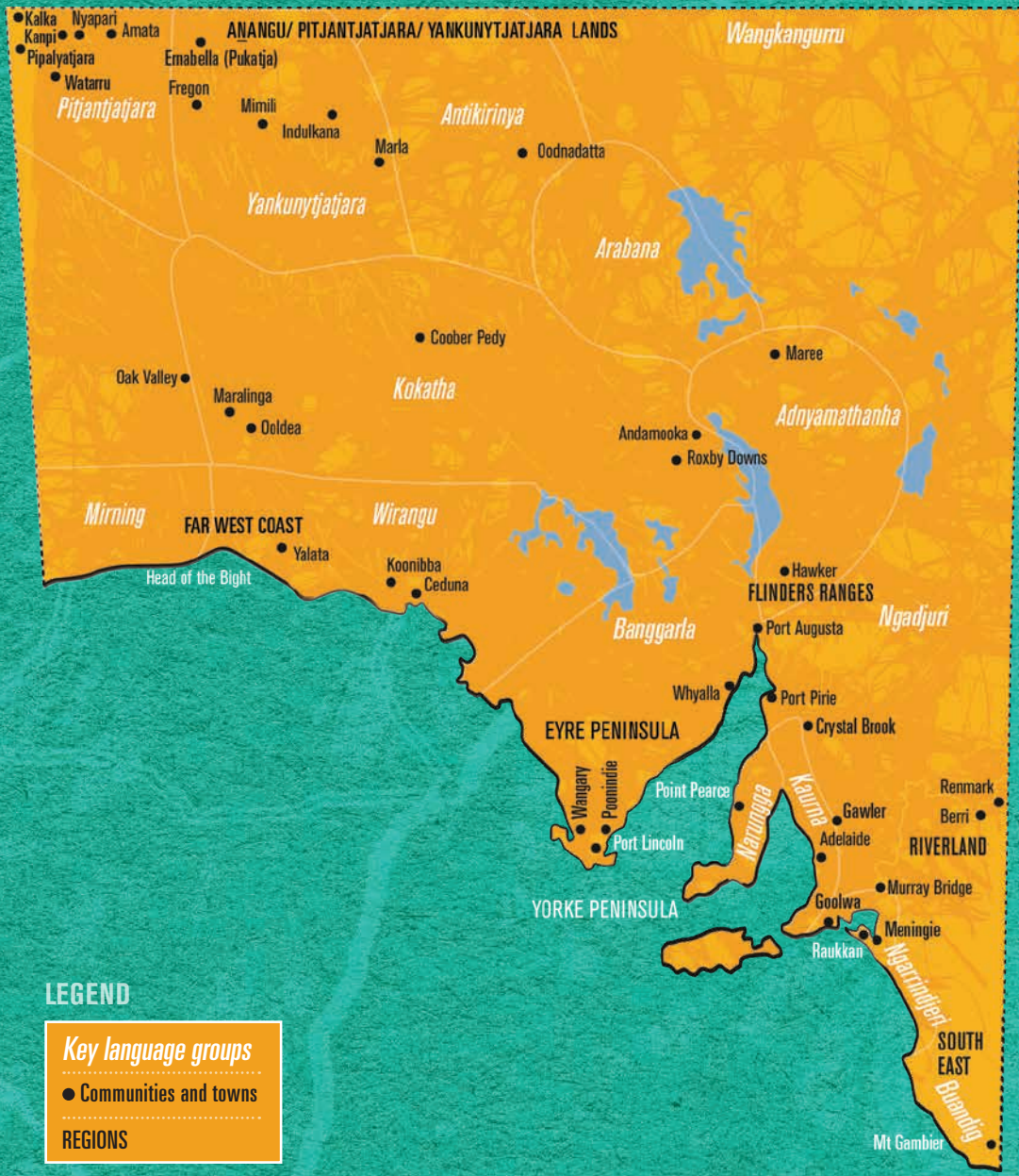

In 2019, Ku Arts delivered a series of OUR MOB development workshops in Goolwa, Murray Bridge, Berri and Mount Gambier, supported by Arts South Australia. We also ran creative workshops in Adelaide, across ceramics and painting, in partnership with Adelaide College of the Arts/TAFE and with generous support from Onesixteenth Indigenous Collective. This saw approximately 80 artists across these regions engage with our creative program, many of whom chose to enter work in this year's exhibition and contribute to the diverse range of artwork you see presented.

Ku Arts is the South Australian support organisation for Aboriginal art centres and artists, with art centre membership in the APY Lands and Ceduna. We also deliver the Statewide Indigenous Community Arts Development (SICAD) program to support artists outside of the APY Lands where there are typically no community owned Aboriginal art centres. The annual SICAD series of artistic workshops and professional development programs offers artists the opportunity to explore new methods and mediums to invigorate their creative practice, and develop longer term, community driven projects.

The strength of OUR YOUNG MOB entries always delights and this year, as in every year, our founding Director Inawinytji Williamson found it hard to choose just one winner. Ku Arts is proud to continue sponsorship of OUR YOUNG MOB award which encourages creative practice and cultural expression from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists aged 18 and under. We are proud of every OUR YOUNG MOB artist who has chosen to share this with us.

## DON DUNSTAN FOUNDATION AWARD WINNER 2018: TONY WILSON

Tony Wilson is a Kurna/Ngarrindjeri/Narrunga contemporary artist based in Adelaide. He creates intricate and evocative works of art that explore themes of identity, collective resonance and connectedness. Heavily influenced by his cultural heritage and interactions with people and Country, Tony's work propels us to 'the space between our thoughts'. These spaces call us to identify ourselves by our inner selves, our essential core beings, and to use them to interpret and filter the outer layers that build us: our culture, our personality and our emotions.

Self-empowerment is a central theme in Tony's artistic practice, which is focused on painting and inspired by the special moments that make us pause and bring us into the present. He is passionate about sharing knowledge and connecting with young people through his work. As an artist-in-residence at a local school he leads a youth art mentoring program. Looking beyond simply teaching students to create works, these classes aim to foster a place where children can express their feelings and find a way to connect with culture and family through art. A place where both student and teacher can learn from each other through their sharing of creative ideas.

Winning the 2018 Don Dunstan Award enabled Tony, in 2019 to travel to Italy, where without daily distractions, he was able to spend his time focused purely on creating his art.

Starting each day with a ritual of morning coffee, Tony would follow this with up to twelve hours straight of painting. This routine continued over many weeks and led to the outstanding works in two solo exhibitions one of which is featured in OUR MOB 2019.

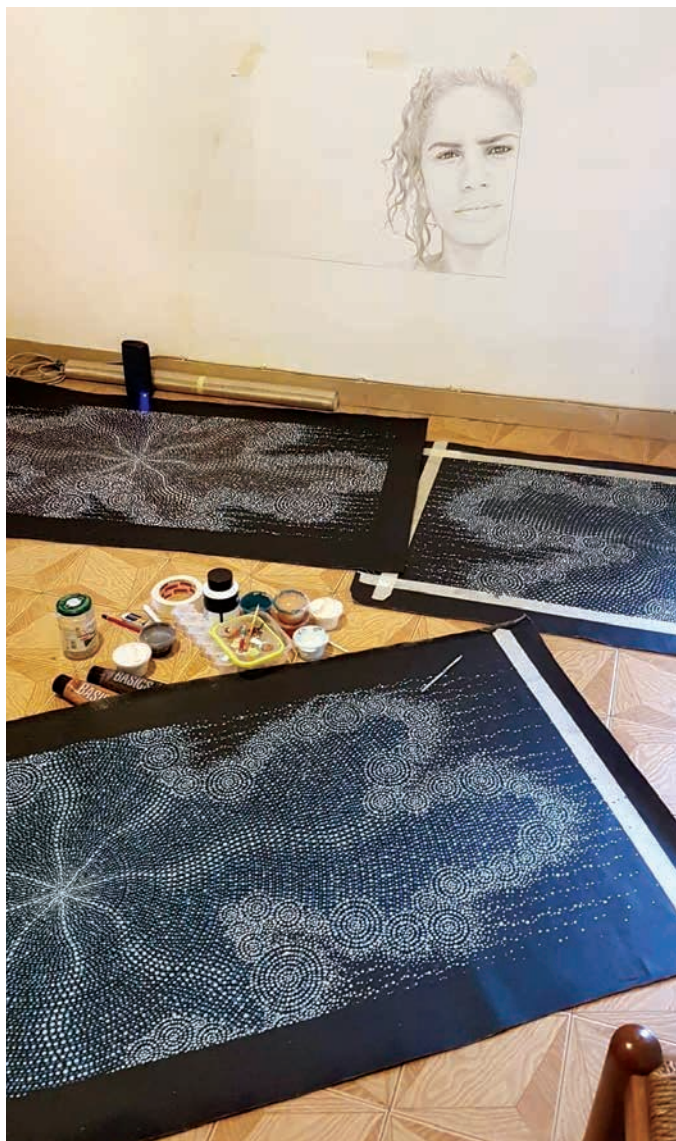
Opportunities such as this are rare and allow a chance for artists such as Tony to challenge themselves by pushing new boundaries through techniques and self-expression.

### DAVID MILLER – THE STORY OF THIS WORK

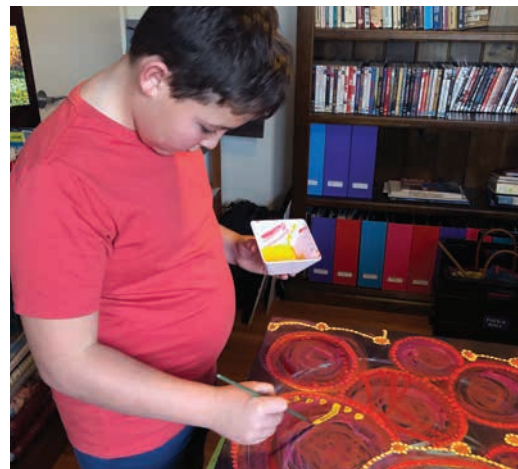

### RHYLEY CHENOWETH – THE STORY OF THIS WORK

I am a 10-year-old Ngarrindjeri boy living with my two foster mums. The story of this painting shows me surrounded by the important women in my life. You will find me as the bigger, bluish circle. In the top left-hand corner is my Nana who I met at the park when I was four. She is the great grandmother of my cousins who live near Keith with my aunties. I've had a sleepover with them, and it was great. They are in the circle between me and my Nana. They stay with us when they come to Adelaide. My birth mother is in the top right-hand corner. I want to meet her again and my mums are helping me. My main mum is below me in the circle in the middle at the bottom. She has looked after and loved me since I was four weeks old. The other circles represent my spare mum and her family, my main mum's family, my respite family and special friends who are always there for me. The overall earth tones of the picture and the wavy paths at the top connect me with my birth family. The straight lines on the side are the streets of the city where I live.
